# **CSR Theology Resource File**

When CSR did the climate change survey with MCI leaders, some asked for us to provide a theology of climate change. Our research showed that there is a huge amount of information and theological papers written on climate change, each drawing on expert opinion from across the globe and the church and we were unlikely to be able to add to that body of knowledge. On reflection CSR felt that it may be more useful to the Connexion to review and recommend theological study materials which could be used in local congregations or by individuals who wish to better understand the biblical context for caring for God's creation. A resource file is created in the CSR section of the web site and will be added to periodically.

### Hope in God's Future: Christian Discipleship in the Context of Climate Change

A report of a joint working group on climate change and theology convened by the Baptist Union of Great Britain, the Methodist Church and the United Reformed Church Study guide reflections, sample group sessions, prayers and a list of follow-up resources have been added to the report to aid engagement with it. The report is structured in five sections;

- 1. Approaching God in the context of climate change.
- 2. Encountering the Word of God.
- 3. Responding to God's Word.
- 4. The body of Christ in the World.
- 5. Sending out

This report is very comprehensive and therefore quite long however it is quite accessible and suitable for individual use and with facilitation, group use.

#### A Brief Theology of Creation Care Prepared by Rick Faw of A Rocha

This brief and very useable resource is based around 6 Principles;

- 1. God loves all of creation.
- 2. Creation reveals God.
- 3. People are an inseparable part of creation
- 4. People have a special role within and unique responsibilities for creation
- 5. In our fallen condition, we are alienated from creation
- 6. God's plan of salvation includes the restoration and redemption of creation

Suitable for individual study or group study. Also suitable for ministers preparing a taught study or sermons on Creation Care.
