The Methodist Church in Ireland is a community of people drawn together by God's love who seek to live wholeheartedly as followers of Jesus for the transformation of the world.

Background

The Greenisland Society is part of the Carrickfergus Circuit which includes Islandmagee, Whitehead and Carrickfergus. We are a small congregation of 40 Families who love God and seek to serve Him in the area, together with local churches, to make Him known.

Each week there is an established Bible Study with prayer, a drop inn for tea and coffee, a community Girls' Brigade Company of 100 members who meet on the premises, a Shell Club group averaging 18 members with ages ranging from 5-12 years who meet for games, crafts and bible stories.

During the summer all the churches in the area come together and organise a week of outreach in the community.

In Greenisland we are praying for someone with a heart for young and old, who will give leadership to our existing committed volunteers.

Main Responsibilities

Worship, Preaching and Teaching

- Lead worship and/or preach on each Sunday in line with the Circuit preaching rota. This
 will principally be in Greenisland but will also include occasional services in other churches
 on the Carrickfergus circuit.
- Share in seasonal services; Christmas, Easter, Harvest, Remembrance etc.
- Lead and facilitate weekly society bible study and prayer meetings.
- Share in other circuit and local community worship events as required.

Evangelism

• Lead, coordinate and facilitate evangelistic work in the Greenisland area, together with youth and children's initiatives including Sunday Schools, Girls' Brigade, Shell Club, fellowship groups and any special events required by the Church Council.

STATEMENT OF FAITH OF THE METHODIST CHURCH IN IRELAND

The Methodist Church in Ireland is a community of people who are drawn together by God's love as they know it, expressed in the story of Jesus - his birth and life, teaching, suffering, death and resurrection. We seek to follow the way of Jesus and live to share God's love through action and word in the world. Because this experience of Jesus Christ has so shaped our lives, we invite others to share in the love, life and hope that is freely given to us.

The Methodist Church as part of the worldwide church shares those core beliefs passed down from the time of the Apostles. Those beliefs are founded on the Bible and are summed up in the creeds, which are regularly used in Christian services of all denominations. The word "creed" comes from the Latin "credo" meaning "I believe." The two better-known creeds are the 4th century Nicene Creed and this, the simpler Apostles' Creed:

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy catholic Church,

the communion of saints,

the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body,

and the life everlasting.

Employees in roles where there is an occupational requirement for the role to be undertaken by a Christian are asked to confirm their agreement with the Apostles' Creed, which is accepted by the Methodist Church in Ireland as a summary of core Christian beliefs.
